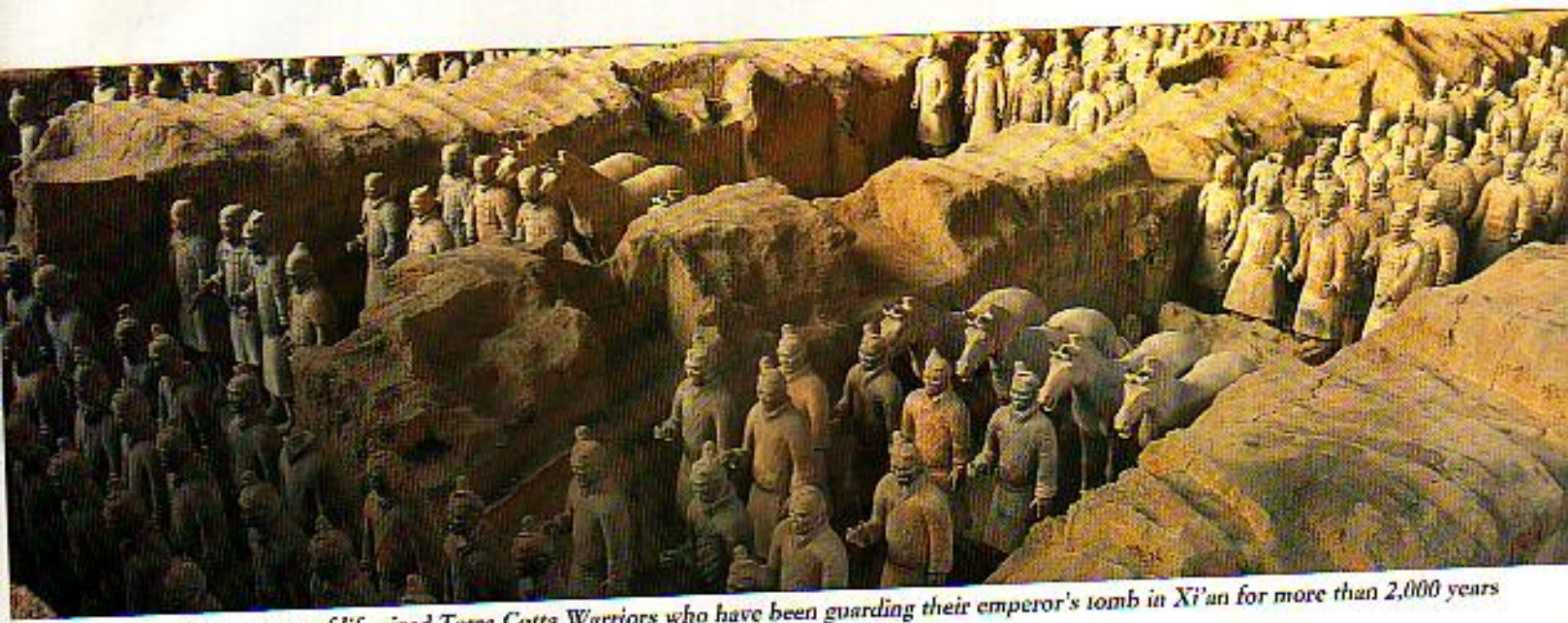
Certainly, floating slowly down

enslaved monarch.



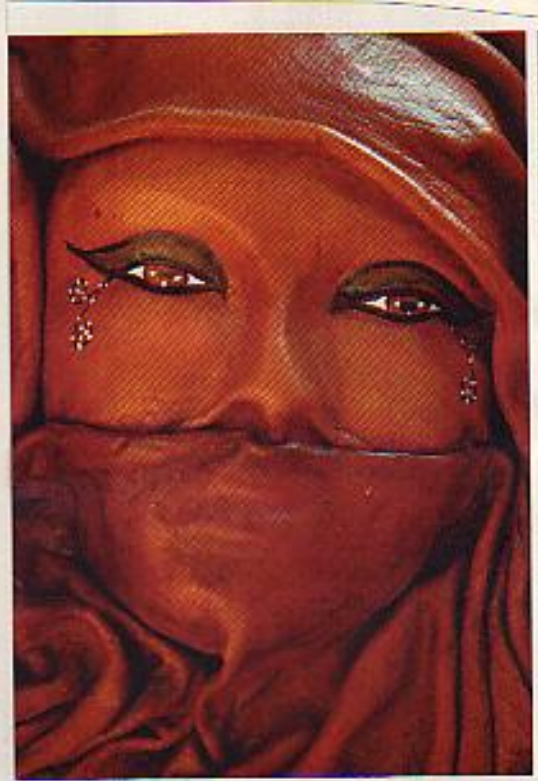
Who would be brave enough to ride
